

To help support S.L.A.A.'s vital services...the suggested 60-40 contribution plan meets basic needs.

Here's how:

After regular expenses are met (rent, literature, F.W.S. delegate travel fund, and prudent reserve funds), remaining amounts may be distributed as follows or whatever suits local needs:

60% to Intergroup

Provides services which may include:

- Maintaining telephone service for 12th step calls and inquiries;
- Mailing free literature and meeting information to newcomers;
- Arranging special events;
- Publishing newsletters and local meeting lists;
- Facilitating S.L.A.A. literature sales;
- Coordinating group activities;
- Responding to local public information requests.

40% to Fellowship-Wide Services

Provides services which may include:

- Maintaining the F.W.S. Office;
- Supporting group and intergroup directories and records;
- Providing assistance and starter kits to groups;
- Publishing S.L.A.A. Literature, the F.W.S. Newsletter and *the Journal*;
- Producing and shipping more than a hundred thousand pieces of S.L.A.A. literature a year;
- Sponsoring the Annual Business Conference/Meeting;
- Helping lone members and those in institutions;
- Carrying the S.L.A.A. message through public information and cooperation with professionals.

How You Can Contribute to F.W.S.

Regular contribution. The group sends a donation every month, every two months, or quarterly.

Anniversary contribution. Individuals celebrate their S.L.A.A. anniversary by giving one dollar for every year in the program.

Individual contributions may be sent directly to the F.W.S. Office. Your group may be credited if you so request. Limit: \$12,000 per year.

In memorial gifts. To express gratitude for a deceased member, individual members and groups send a contribution in that S.L.A.A.'s name.

Bequests in wills. Acceptable only from S.L.A.A. members. Limit: \$12,000.

Special contributions. Money raised at conventions, marathons, and other special events, sent by sponsoring body.

Endowment Fund. A newly created fund to assure that the fellowship is here today *and* tomorrow. Contributions to the fund are not currently limited in amount, hence the \$12,000 annual limit on individual 7th Tradition contributions does not apply to this fund.

The 7th Tradition

In financial matters, Tradition Seven states that Sex and Love Addicts Anonymous is self-supporting at all levels. What this clearly means is that neither the group, the intergroup, or F.W.S. accepts outside contributions.

In accordance with Tradition Six, S.L.A.A. at all levels makes no contributions to any outside organization or cause, no matter how worthy.

Who Manages F.W.S.'s Finances?

The S.L.A.A. Board of Trustees is directly responsible for the management of F.W.S.'s receipts and expenditures. An Office Operating Committee of the Board meets twice a month to oversee the operations of the F.W.S. Office and to review financial statements. Each September the Board reviews and approves the budget for the coming fiscal year.

A full accounting of S.L.A.A.'s finances is provided in the Annual Business Meeting Report.

Group and Intergroup Contributions to Fellowship-Wide Services

Many groups and intergroups have committed themselves to the support of F.W.S. by sending contributions, either in fixed amounts or percentage of receipts.

What if There is No Intergroup in Your Local Area?

Most groups send F.W.S. a gift of the money which remains after fixed group expenses are paid. For a time, the Fellowship-Wide Office is their main link to other recovering sex and love addicts. When a local intergroup is formed the group usually votes to support both the intergroup and F.W.S..

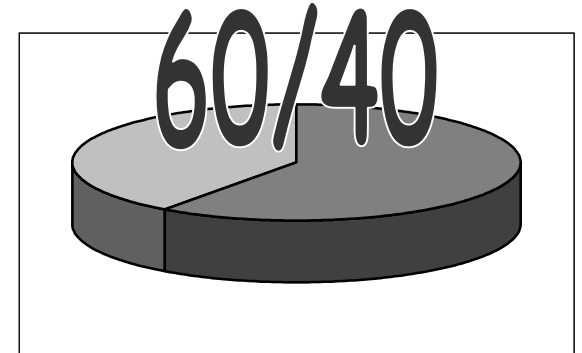
